Supporting Women and Girls Across Chicago

"The scouts offer a foundation for little girls and our younger generation to learn teamwork, develop self-confidence and have exposure to many things outside of their own community. It's a great beginning for many young girls who will become our future leaders."

Meanwhile, our Algonquin, McHenry and Round Lake Beach stores joined forces to donate \$3,000 to <u>Turning Point Domestic Violence Services</u>. Turning Point provides intervention services, emergency shelter and a 24-hour helpline for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, as well as prevention training.

Organizations like Turning Point are more vital in our communities than ever as the pandemic drove more families into close quarters under increased stress.
