Dick started as a selector alongside the Big Blue Monster and eventually transitioned into logistics, embodying the growth opportunities we offer our team members. His story, like many others, reflects the personal and professional growth nurtured within our operations.

"For a while there, I was at the end of that machine, loading the carts and pushing them over to the truck bays," Dick shared.

The complex's impact extended beyond grocery logistics; 1974 also saw the establishment of a dedicated facility for fleet maintenance, emphasizing our holistic approach to infrastructure development. Throughout the decade, our expansions continued with additions like cold storage facilities and specialized areas for produce, dairy, and general merchandise, cementing Lansing's pivotal role in our supply chain network.

Simon Reiffer, another long-time team member who is now retired, started in a Grand Rapids store at age 16. Simon first transferred to the Walker Distribution Center, then moved to Lansing in 1977. For him, it was an opportunity to be near the top of the seniority list in a new warehouse.

"Looking back, Meijer was a great place to work," said Simon. "They treated me well and helped me when I needed it."

Today, the Meijer Lansing Distribution Complex spans over 2.7 million square feet, employing more than 2,500 Meijer team members across various operational sectors.
