The Equest Center for Therapeutic Riding Continues Decades-Long Partnership with Meijer

Our relationship with Equest Center began with a shared vision: To make a meaningful difference in the lives of individuals with disabilities. Over the years, we've sponsored signature events, special programs and initiatives. The Equest Center was also a recipient of our Meijer Team Gives program in 2021.
